LONGWOOD MEN'S BASKETBALL

Series History

Longwood and Kentucky are meeting for the first-time ever in the sport of men's basketball. The two schools, however, have played each other in women's basketball as the host Wildcats won by a score of 79-41 in that sport's only meeting (1.4.05). The Lancers are also playing a member of the Southeastern Conference (SEC) for the first-time ever, though will play at Florida (1.6.09) as well.

A Look At Kentucky

Kentucky has a record of 1-2 after a 71-42 home win past Delaware State University on Saturday (11.22). The Wildcats are coached by second-year head coach Billy Gillispie (Texas State '83; 119-73, 7th year). Kentucky finished 18-13 a year ago, including 12-4 in the SEC for second place in the East Division. The Wildcats are led by junior Jodie Meeks (G, 6-4, 208) along with sophomore Patrick Patterson (F, 6-9, 235) and junior Ramon Harris (F, 6-7, 218). Meeks averages 26.7 points, including 22 against DSU, while Patterson and Harris add 12.0 and 11.7 points, respectively.

Findlay Toyota/Las Vegas Invitational

Longwood is participating in the exempt four-game Findlay Toyota/Las Vegas Invitational November 20-29. The first two games of the event will be on the road at West Virginia (11.20), and at Kentucky (11.24); before playing two games at the Orleans Arena in Las Vegas, Nevada against Southeast Missouri State (11.28) and either Delaware State or Oakland (11.29). Also playing in the eight-team tournament are Iowa and Kansas State.

A Look At Longwood

Longwood has a record of 3-2 after a 61-49 road win at Maryland-Eastern Shore on Saturday (11.22), its best start since first playing a Division I schedule in 2004-05. The Lancers were led by junior Kevin Swecker with a season-high 17 points, including 3-5 three-point field goals and 6-6 free throws. Senior captain Ryan Bogan had 12 points, while redshirt-junior captain Dana Smith scored nine points against the Hawks. LU made 17-20 free throws in the contest, including 9-11 during the final 1:24 to secure the road victory. The Lancers are playing their sixth game in 11 days to open this season, and their third road game in the past five days.

Head Coach Mike Gillian

Mike Gillian (North Adams State '86) was named the seventh head coach for men's basketball at Longwood on May 2, 2003. Prior to his arrival, he had been an assistant coach for Jim Larranaga at George Mason for six years (1997-2003) after a year with Coach Larranaga at Bowling Green State (1996-97). A native of Ayer, Massachusetts, Coach Gillian is 37-118 at Longwood, including back-to-back 9-22 seasons, those following a record of 10-20 three years ago during 2005-06 that tied for the seventh-best turnaround season in Division I that year.

Team Captains

Ryan Bogan and Dana Smith were named team captains by head coach Mike Gillian for 2008-09, the first year that each is serving in this team leadership role. Bogan is a second-year team member after transferring from Harcum College in Philadelphia. Smith is a fifth-year team member who has been granted two medical hardship waivers for consecutive knee injuries each of the past two seasons.

The Unkind Road

Longwood has traveled to 24 different states and Washington, D.C. while playing 76 games away from Farmville during the last four years, including 64 true road games (4-60). The Lancers' favorite states to visit since 2004-05 include North Carolina (7) and Nevada (4) along with the District of Columbia (4). Longwood's record is 3-9 in the 12 neutral-site games.

One Degree Down, One To Go

Dana Smith has junior-eligibility after being granted medical hardship waivers following each of the past two seasons for knee injuries. He earned a bachelor of science degree in sociology from Longwood in May 2008, and is now working toward his second undergraduate degree in business marketing. Smith's first collegiate knee injury happened at Norfolk State (11.15.06) to the right knee, and the second was suffered at James Madison (12.5.07) to the left knee; he underwent successful reconstructive surgery on December 27, 2007. It was his third knee injury in five years. Smith has started 37 of 78 career games, including 31 consecutive games around the recent injuries over the past three years. He is averaging a team-best 14.0 points and 6.4 rebounds, and has 586 career points (7.5) and 317 career rebounds (4.1) with career-highs of 21 points and 11 rebounds. Both of his parents were born and raised in nearby Winchester, Kentucky.

Strong Finish - Fast Start

Ryan Bogan started the final 23 games last year, finishing strong with averages of 15.0 points (20-41 3FG), 5.4 rebounds, and 3.3 assists over final seven games. He had his finest game in the season finale at home against Liberty (2.22.08), posting a career-high of 23 points while making a career-high 7-10 three-point field goals. Bogan added 21 points against NJIT (2.18.08) in the next-to-last game of the campaign, making 4-6 three-pointers, and for the season had averages of 30.5 minutes, 11.7 points, 4.8 rebounds, and 2.3 assists. He led the Lancers in three-point field goals (64), three-point field goal attempts (162-5.2), and free throw percentage (.829, 58-70). Bogan made 22-straight free throws over a 10-game stretch last year before an intentional miss against Campbell (1.15.08), and finished 42-46 (.913) after entering the starting lineup. He earned NJCAA Region 19 Player of the Year honors at Harcum where he scored 1,106 points in two seasons after surpassing 1,500 career points in high school (Oxford [Pa.] Area) while earning All-State accolades. Bogan is averaging 13.4 points, adding 4.4 rebounds and 2.8 assists -- his career-high in rebounds is 13 which he posted at NJIT last year (2.4.08).

Healthy This Year

Kevin Swecker is healthy and in the starting lineup this season, averaging 10.2 points (8-19 3FG). He missed the first eight games of 2007-08 after a bout with mononucleosis, and then missed four more games with a foot injury late in the season. Swecker averaged 14.0 points (10-17 3FG) over final three games last year, and overall averaged career-bests of 19.9 minutes, 8.8 points, 2.5 rebounds, and 1.0 assists. He led the team in three-point field goal percentage (.380, 62-163), and scored a career-high 23 points (5-7 3FG) against Stetson (Dec. 29), and had 22 points with a career-best six three-pointers (6-10) against Campbell (Jan. 15). Swecker helped his Mount Saint Joseph high school team to a record of 38-1 during 2005-06. The third-team All-Baltimore Catholic League selection averaged 10.5 points and was one of five starters at MSJ, a program ranked among the Top Ten in the final USA TODAY national high school rankings that year, who earned Division I scholarships.

Like Father, Like Son

Billy Robinson Jr. is a second-generation college basketball player. His father, Billy Sr., played at Northern Illinois (1982-84). Billy Jr. averaged 13.3 points (16-26 FG) and 4.3 rebounds over the final three games of 2007-08, and overall averaged career-bests of 12.3 minutes, 4.0 points, and 2.6 rebounds. He posted career-highs of 18 points and nine rebounds last season at Liberty (11.27.07). Robinson Jr. has started each game this season, averaging 4.4 points and 4.4 rebounds.

Strongest Man

Durann Neil is a second-year team member and the strongest player on the team, as evidenced by his bench press of 325 pounds; the strongest of all 240-plus student-athletes at Longwood -- based on the bench press. He played in 27 games during 2007-08 while averaging 13.1 minutes, 4.3 points, 1.0

rebounds, and 1.0 assists with a career-high 16 points (4-8 3FG) vs. Southern Virginia (1.31.08). Neil made 15-37 three-point field goals (.405) over his last nine games a year ago. He has started each game this season, averaging 6.4 points and 3.6 assists with only five turnovers in five games (1.0).

Immediate Impacts

Antwan Carter is a first-year team member and true freshman left-handed post player who scored a season-high nine points against Norfolk State (11.16), and grabbed a season-high nine rebounds in his collegiate debut against Virginia-Wise (11.14). Carter (5.2 points, 5.0 rebounds, 10-13 FT) has eight siblings: two sisters and six brothers, including a twin (Anthony). Classmate Martiz Washington scored a season-high 15 points in his collegiate debut against Virginia-Wise (11.14), and is averaging 8.0 points (9-22 3FG) with only three turnovers in five games (0.6). Both he and Carter will see lots of playing time this season for the Lancers.

Playing Nationally-Ranked Opponents

Longwood has played five nationally-ranked teams since its first complete Division I schedule in 2004-05. That first year was brutal with games at #1 Illinois and #6 Wake Forest, and against #17 Cincinnati in Las Vegas. The Lancers played #4 Villanova in Atlantic City during 2005-06, and were on the road at #8 Indiana during 2007-08. Longwood has also competed against such historic and storied college basketball programs as Virginia, Providence, and San Francisco; as well as nationally prominent programs at Boston College, George Washington, Kansas State, Kent State, Louisiana Tech, Navy, Nebraska, New Mexico, Northern Iowa, Oklahoma, Southern California, and Valparaiso.

Home Sweet Home

Longwood is now 23-16 at home in Willett Hall over the past three-plus years, including a 7-5 record in Farmville during 2007-08. The Lancers were 8-4 at the facility during 2005-06 before finishing with a record of 6-6 at home during 2006-07.

First-Time Opponents

Longwood is scheduled to play nine first-time opponents in men's basketball this season. They include West Virginia (11.20), Kentucky (11.24), Delaware State or Oakland (11.29), Virginia Tech (12.14), Lehigh (12.28), Florida (1.6), Chicago State (1.12, 2.16), Texas-Pan American (2.11, 2.14), and Colgate (2.21).

Playing The Commonwealth

Longwood has played 11 of the other 13 Division I schools located within the Commonwealth of Virginia since 2003-04. They include Hampton, James Madison, Liberty, Norfolk State, Old Dominion, Radford, Richmond, Virginia, VCU, VMI, along with William and Mary. The Lancers will add #12 this year when they travel to Blacksburg to play Virginia Tech on December 14. The only other Virginia school that has not been scheduled previously is George Mason. However, Longwood has scrimmaged against the Patriots during preseason on two occasions, including just prior to the start of 2006-07 when George Mason made its remarkable run to the NCAA Final Four.

Spanning The Globe

Longwood team members were born in seven states, the District of Columbia, and three European countries. They include Virginia (Brandon Evans), Colorado (Dana Smith), Florida (Antwan Carter), Maryland (Earl Gee II, Kevin Swecker), New Jersey (Durann Neil), New York (Jeffrey Ryan, Kirk Williams), Pennsylvania (Ryan Bogan), and D.C. (Billy Robinson Jr.); along with Brazil (Beno Jaekel), Germany (E.J. Dawson, Martiz Washington), and The Netherlands (J. van der Kooij).

Did You Know ...

Dana Smith has a cousin, Nick Brooks, who played college basketball at Butler ... Kevin Swecker is a cousin to Duke University assistant coach Steve Wojciechowski who also played for the Blue Devils ... Jerome Kersey, who played 17 years in the NBA (11 in Portland) and won a championship in San Antonio (1999), played at Longwood from 1980-84 ... Michael Tucker, who played 12 years of MLB (10th pick of 1st round by Kansas City in 1992 MLB Draft), attended Longwood from 1990-92 and was a starter on the 1992 U.S. Olympic Baseball Team ... Tucker and Kersey also graduated from the same Virginia high school (Bluestone HS in Clarksville) ... Tina Barrett, who played 19 years on the LPGA Tour, graduated from Longwood in 1988.

The Three-Point Stat

Longwood has now made at least one three-point field goal in 182 consecutive games, dating back to November 26, 2002 at Lenoir-Rhyne (W 72-68), including a high of 16 three-pointers last season against Campbell on January 15, 2008 (L 82-80) at home in Willett Hall.

Founded in 1839, Longwood offers undergraduate programs in business administration, education and human services, the arts and sciences, plus graduate programs in education, English, sociology, and a new MBA in Retail Management.

Longwood is committed to developing citizen leaders and provides a meaningful learning environment where students learn skills, knowledge and theory and then translate learning into action by doing research, internships, fieldwork and community service. Longwood requires that every freshman have a laptop computer, and the university integrates technology throughout the learning process. Longwood is also one of the few institutions nationwide to require all students to have an internship or some form of experiential learning prior to graduation.

The Longwood learning environment is enriched by the Greenwood Library that holds 245,000 book titles, 2,100 print journal subscriptions, and some 100 electronic databases including access to 11,000 full-text electronic journals and provides state-of-the-art technology for information retrieval from libraries throughout the world, as well as satellite reception of foreign programs and web access.



Longwood provides a range of business services to the region and state through the Longwood Small Business Development Center, while the Longwood Center for the Visual Arts serves as an important and innovative study center and cultural resource for the Commonwealth of Virginia.

Additionally, Longwood University has a tremendous economic and cultural impact on Farmville and the surrounding communities. A recent study conducted by the Longwood Small Business Development Center estimates that university employees, students, and visitors spent over \$100 million in 2001—with 54 percent of that amount being spent in Farmville and the eight surrounding counties.

Longwood students continue to rate their university as one of the most engaging in the country, according to results from the National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE). In the 2002 survey, seniors rated Longwood at or above the 80th percentile on six of the nine NSSE benchmarks when compared with Masters institutions; freshmen rated Longwood at or above the 60th percentile on all nine benchmarks when compared with Masters institutions.

Finally, for the tenth straight year, Longwood University was ranked among the best in the 2008 U.S. News & World Report "America's Best Colleges." The 2008 Report ranked Longwood as one of the "Top Public Universities—Master's" in the South at the #11 position. Among all Southern Universities—Master's (public and private) Longwood moved up within the top tier to position #31 from #33 in 2007. Additionally, Longwood was one of only 146 schools in the Southeast listed as a "Best Southeastern College" in the 2008 Princeton Review.



Men's Basketball at Longwood University has become the school's most visible and popular intercollegiate sport since playing its first game on November 30, 1976. Since that humble beginning 32 years ago (an 82-56 loss at Mary Washington), the Lancers have earned over 425 victories (428-447).

Longwood is competing in its 33rd year of competition in men's basketball during 2008-09, and oh how far the program has grown. The Lancers played NCAA Division III basketball at the beginning, though quickly established themselves at that level while advancing to the 1980 Division III Final Four. Longwood moved up to Division II certification the following season (1980-81), and made three more appearances in NCAA post-season tournaments (1994, 1995, 2001); posting 12 winning seasons, including three 20-win campaigns, and three other years at an even .500 record.

The late 1990's into the new millennium was a period of time during which the school would begin discussions to move to Division I Athletics.

In a letter dated November 12, 2002, school president Dr. Patricia P. Cormier informed the NCAA of Longwood's desire to reclassify its intercollegiate athletic program to Division I status, and the institution began an NCAA-mandated five-year process, including a four-year reclassification period (2003-07) that followed a one-year 'exploratory period' (2002-03), to change its membership from Division II to Division I.

Longwood brought Mike Gillian on-board for the transition, and after playing a Division II schedule during 2003-04, the Lancers began competing with a full Division I schedule in 2004-05. The reclassification was difficult as Longwood played just 35 of 92 games at home from 2004-07, though the Lancers demonstrated steady improvement. Longwood improved from a 1-30 record in 2004-05, to 10-20 in 2005-06, and finished with a 9-22 record in 2006-07; playing a progressively better schedule each year.

Dr. Cormier received a letter from The NCAA dated July 11, 2007, stating that the organization's Division I Management Council Administrative Committee, acting on behalf of the Division I Management Council, had approved the recommendation from the Division I Management Council Membership Subcommittee to transfer Longwood to Division I active membership as of September 1. The Lancers, along with UC Davis and Northern Colorado, competed during 2007-08 as the newest members of NCAA Division I.

Longwood is now under the direction of head coach Mike Gillian for the sixth year as he has led the Lancers into the Division I Era which officially began last year after the full NCAA Certification. Coach Gillian's appointment as head coach on May 2, 2003 signified a new foundation for Longwood Basketball.



MIKE GILLIAN was named the seventh men's basketball head coach in the history of Longwood University on May 2, 2003. Coach Gillian, in his sixth year during 2008-09, has built an NCAA Division I program from the ground up since his arrival as Longwood experienced its four-year Reclassification from Division II (2003-07). The Lancers have won 28 games over the past three seasons, including identical 9-22 records each of the last two campaigns (2007-08, 2006-07), following a 10-win season during 2005-06 (10-20) that tied as the seventh-best turnaround season in Division I (plus 9.5) that year.

Coach Gillian's five-year overall record at Longwood entering 2008-09 was 34-116, including an overall homecourt record of 24-35 in Willett Hall prior to this year; the program was 21-15 at home over the past three years. The Lancers have played a total of 91 games outside of Farmville during the last five seasons, including 76 true road games (6-70) and 15 neutral-site games (4-11).

Longwood will compete this season with its full allotment of 13 scholarship student-athletes after playing with 12 during 2007-08 following two years (2005-06, 2006-07) with 11 scholarships. The Lancers finished 1-30 during 2004-05, their first year competing against a full Division I schedule with nine scholarships. Longwood was 5-22 during 2003-04, the first year under Coach Gillian as well as year one of the transition to Division I with just seven scholarships.

"We have gotten to the point where we have established Longwood Basketball as a respectable Division I program," says Gillian. "On one side, the journey to this point has been long, arduous and gratifying. We have traveled the country and played against some of college basketball's best teams. We have built competitive rivalries with a lot of programs in the state of Virginia. We have made Willett Hall a difficult place for opponents to play, and won a lot of those home games. On the other side, the journey that lies ahead is filled with monumental challenges. We must now utilize all of these past experiences to vault the program forward from respectability to success. No easy task. It's time to rise to the Occasion!"

Prior to his arrival at Longwood, Coach Gillian had been an assistant coach at George Mason University under head coach Jim Larranaga from 1997-2003. He had also worked under Larranaga for one season at Bowling Green State (Ohio) University (1996-97) before moving with him to George Mason. Gillian played a role in the recruitment of several members of the Mason team that shocked the world of college basketball during the 2005-06 season while advancing to the Final Four in Indianapolis.

During Gillian's six seasons as an assistant coach at Mason, the Patriots went 100-74 overall with a 66-34 Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) record, winning two CAA Tournament championships (1999, 2001) and two CAA regular season titles (1999, 2000). He counts George Evans, currently playing overseas, and Jason Miskiri, who made the 1999 Charlotte Hornets' opening day roster, among the many standout players he helped coach at GMU. George Mason also earned two NCAA Tournament appearances (1999, 2001) and made one National Invitation Tournament (NIT) appearance (2002). The Patriots were 57-18 overall at home in the Patriot Center, posting a 41-8 CAA homecourt record.

At Bowling Green, the Falcons finished 22-10 while winning the 1997 Mid-American Conference regular season title (13-5) and earning an NIT appearance. MAC Player of the Year Antonio Daniels, currently a member of the NBA's Washington Wizards, led that BGSU team.

Prior to joining Larranaga at BGSU, Gillian was an assistant coach at Division II American International (Mass.) from 1989-95. During that six-year stint working for current Indiana Pacers assistant coach Jimmy Powell, the Yellow Jackets went 117-58 overall with a 75-33 Northeast-10 Conference (NE-10) record, winning both the NE-10 regular season and tournament championships in 1994 (26-6). American International also advanced to the second-round of the Division II Tournament that year.

Gillian has been a member of the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) since 1989. He was a YES Clinic speaker at the Division I Men's Final Four from 1998-2000, and again in 2007 in Atlanta, and has extensive public speaking experience through his involvement with numerous boosters, local businesses, civic organizations, and charity events. In addition, since arriving at Longwood, Gillian has appeared on ESPN2's Cold Pizza, become a weekly in-season guest on Richmond Sports Radio 910 (The Final Round With Wes McElroy, The Mike Maniscalco Show), served as the same station's NCAA Tournament Analyst, co-hosted his own in-season Mike Gillian Show on Farmville's Kickin' Country 92.9, and has been interviewed by numerous sportswriters, radio personalities, and web-bloggers.

Gillian was a four-year letterwinner as an undergraduate at Division III North Adams State (now the Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts), and served as a team captain during his final two years. He received a bachelor of science degree in business administration from North Adams, and earned a master of business administration degree from American International.

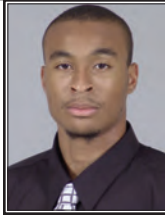

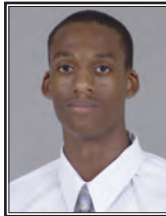

FARMVILLE, Va. -- Longwood opened its 2008-09 season with an 87-44 home victory past visiting NAIA Virginia-Wise in Willett Hall. The Lancers (1-0) led 42-18 at halftime and placed four players in double-figure scoring, led by freshman Martiz Washington with a game-high 15 points off the bench in his first collegiate contest. The Highland Cavaliers (0-4) were led by Kevin Perry with 10 points.

Longwood took control from the beginning against Virginia-Wise, jumping ahead 14-4 at 16:02 as senior captain Ryan Bogan scored eight quick points with consecutive three-point field goals and a jumper. The Lancers extended the advantage to 24-10 at 8:27 on a layup from junior Billy Robinson Jr. that closed a 10-3 run by the hosts. The Highland Cavaliers closed to within 26-18 at 6:01 before LU closed the first half with a 16-0 blitz over the final 5:38 as six different players scored, including six points from sophomore Durann Neil, for the commanding 42-18 lead at the intermission.

Longwood continued its run to start the second half, outscoring Wise 26-4 during the first 8:12 of the period to lead 68-22 with 11:48 remaining. Redshirt-junior captain Dana Smith scored the first six points of the half, while Washington scored 10 points in a dizzying 1:24 with two three-pointers, a steal and layup, and another jumper while Bogan finished the run with another three-pointer for the largest margin of the night (46 points). Junior E.J. Dawson had a crowd-pleasing steal and dunk during the onslaught as well. The lead was never below 40 points over the final 3:59 for the home team as everyone played and scored in the contest witnessed by 1,314.

Washington led Longwood with his game-high 15 points, adding six rebounds and two steals in 18 minutes. Neil added 14 points, five rebounds, and two steals for the Lancers. Others included Bogan with 13 points, six rebounds, three assists, and two steals, while Smith had 10 points, eight rebounds, a career-high five blocks, and two assists. Junior Kevin Swecker finished with nine points and five assists, Robinson Jr. had six points and seven rebounds, Dawson had six points and five assists, and freshman Antwan Carter had six points and nine rebounds. LU shot 44% (32-73) from the field, including 30% (9-30) on three-pointers, and 56% (14-25) at the free throw line. The Lancers took a 53-41 rebounding advantage and only had eight turnovers while forcing 21 miscues.

Perry led Virginia-Wise with 10 points and nine rebounds, while Patrick Fisher had nine points, and Josh Jordan finished with eight points and six rebounds. V-W shot just 27% (15-56) from the field, including 14% (2-14) on three-pointers, and 52% (12-23) at the line.

Longwood now leads the all-time series against the Highland Cavaliers at 8-1 with eight-straight wins, including four in a row over the past four seasons.

Norfolk State 81 - @Longwood 74

FARMVILLE, Va. -- Longwood dropped an 81-74 decision to visiting Norfolk State in Willett Hall. The closed-played contest witnessed 13 lead changes, and 14 ties throughout, and was deadlocked at 74-74 with 2:01 remaining before the visitors scored the game's final seven points for the hard-earned road win. The Lancers (1-1) were led by senior captain Ryan Bogan with 20 points, while the Spartans (1-0) were led by Corey Lyons with a game-high 25 points.

Longwood took an early 10-4 lead at 15:00 as Bogan scored four quick points for the hosts. Norfolk State answered with seven-straight points to lead 11-10 at 14:03 as Michael Deloach scored two baskets and Lyons buried a three-point field goal. The Lancers stretch the advantage back to 21-14 at 9:40 with an 11-4 run sparked by redshirt-junior captain Dana Smith with five points, including a three-pointer. The Spartans, however, fought back with their own run of 23-9 to lead 37-30 at 1:34 as James Williams made two three-pointers and Kyle O'Quinn scored six points inside to spark the visitors who led 37-33 at the intermission.

Longwood battled back in the second half and quickly took a 40-39 lead at 18:37 behind five points from Bogan. Lyons responded with back-to-back three-pointers and Norfolk State led 45-40 at 17:51, and it was 48-44 after a three-point play inside from O'Quinn. The Lancers answered with an 8-1 run to lead 52-49 at 14:12 Bogan scored five more points, including another three-pointer, while junior Kevin Swecker made a three-pointer as well. NSU led 60-57 at 10:38 after an 11-5 run as Lyons again made consecutive three-pointers and a pair of free throws before another three-pointer by Williams as well. LU again rallied back with eight unanswered points capped by another Bogan three-pointer to lead 65-60 at 8:04.

It was tied at 66-66 (6:39), 70-70 (4:55), 72-72 (2:55), and finally at 74-74 with 2:01 left on a pair of free throws by Smith. Unfortunately, Smith fouled out at 1:02 and Deloach subsequently made two free throws to put Norfolk State ahead 76-74. A layup from Aleek Pauline and 3-4 free throws by Deloach over the final 20-seconds sealed the outcome as Longwood missed its final four attempts from the field, including three shots from behind the three-point line.

Bogan led Longwood with 20 points, adding five rebounds, while Smith had a double-double of 16 points and a career-high 11 rebounds, with four steals as well before his disqualification. Swecker finished with 11 points, and freshman Antwan Carter had nine points and six rebounds. LU shot 40% (29-73) from the field, including 28% (9-32) on three-pointers, and 47% (7-15) at the free throw line. The Lancers forced 24 turnovers by the Spartans.

Lyons led Norfolk State with a game-high 25 points, including 6-8 three-pointers and 7-8 free throws, while Deloach had a double-double of 19 points and 10 rebounds, and O'Quinn finished with 12 points and six rebounds. NSU shot 53% (27-51) from the field, including 56% (10-18) on three-pointers, and 90% (17-19) at the line. Norfolk State now leads the all-time series between the two schools at 3-2.

FARMVILLE, Va. -- Longwood took an 85-84 home victory past visiting Gardner-Webb in Willett Hall. Senior captain Ryan Bogan made a free throw with 5.9-seconds remaining, and junior Kevin Swecker stole the ball with two-seconds left to seal the victory. Redshirt-junior captain Dana Smith led the Lancers (2-1) with 18 points while the Runnin' Bulldogs (0-2), who won at Kentucky last year, were led by Anton Silver with a game-high 21 points.

"This is without a doubt one of the best wins in our brief Division I history," said sixth-year head coach Mike Gillian. "It's an indication of how far this program has come, and our next challenge is to realize that this was no mistake - we deserved to win."

Longwood led 48-32 at halftime behind 14 first-half points from Smith, its largest lead of the contest, after closing the first half with a 24-8 run over the final 6:08. Junior E.J. Dawson added nine points, including six over the final 1:48 as the hosts shot 58% (21-36) from the field over the first 20 minutes; limiting Gardner-Webb to just 35% (9-26). The Lancers led for 19:51 of the second half, though the Runnin' Bulldogs erased their large deficit quickly with a 17-6 run to open the half as Grayson Flittner scored six points to trail 54-49 at 15:34. LU was able to maintain the advantage, and led 84-79 after consecutive layups from Bogan (1:20) and Smith (0:46). GWU finally managed to tie the game at 84-84 with just 9.3-seconds left to play when Aaron Linn made a jumper in the lane after a Grayson three-pointer. Bogan was fouled while going to the basket and made the first free throw of a one-and-one opportunity, but missed the second attempt before Swecker's steal prevented Gardner-Webb, who shot 63% (19-30) in the second half, from a possible winning shot attempt.

Smith led Longwood with 18 points on 9-13 shooting from the field to lead five players in double-figures for the hosts. Others included Swecker with 14 points (2-4 3FG), while Bogan, Dawson, and freshman Martiz Washington (3-6 3FG) each finished with 11 points for the Lancers. Sophomore Durann Neil contributed a career-high nine assists while adding six points. LU shot 57% (35-61) from the field, including 33% (6-18) on three-pointers, and 82% (9-11) at the free throw line. The Lancers only had nine turnovers.

Silver led Gardner-Webb with 21 points (9-10 FG, 3-4 3FG) and nine rebounds, while Linn had 20 points, Flittner added 18 points, and Joshua Henley finished with 16 points and eight rebounds. GWU shot 50% (28-56) from the field, including 38% (6-16) on three-pointers, and 76% (22-29) at the line.

Longwood now leads the all-time series against Gardner-Webb at 5-3 with four-straight wins, but the first of the series in Division I. The Runnin' Bulldogs had defeated then #20 Kentucky 84-68 on November 7, 2007, and fell just 65-62 in their season-opener last Friday (11.14) at Virginia Tech.

The Lancers defeated James Madison 77-73 (2.18.06), and High Point 69-64 (1.28.07), along with wins past Liberty each of the past three years (79-68, 2.22.08; 76-70, 2.15.07; 88-75, 11.30.05) among its other key Division I wins.

MORGANTOWN, W.Va. – Longwood dropped an 86-54 decision on the road at West Virginia University during a first-round game of the Findlay Toyota/Las Vegas Invitational in Morgantown, West Virginia. The Lancers (2-2) were led by redshirt-junior Dana Smith with a game-high 17 points. The Mountaineers (2-0) of the BIG EAST Conference were led by Darryl Bryant with 16 points off the bench.

Longwood and West Virginia each started slowly in the whistle-prone contest as the Lancers only trailed 17-10 with 7:48 left in the first half after a jumper from senior Ryan Bogan. The Mountaineers, however, closed the opening period with a 26-9 run to take control and lead 43-19 at the intermission. LU was able to close to within 51-28 with 17:10 remaining on a jumper from Smith but WVU used a 12-3 run to lead 63-31 at 11:23.
