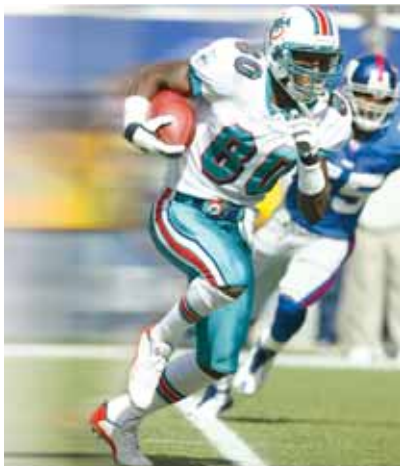

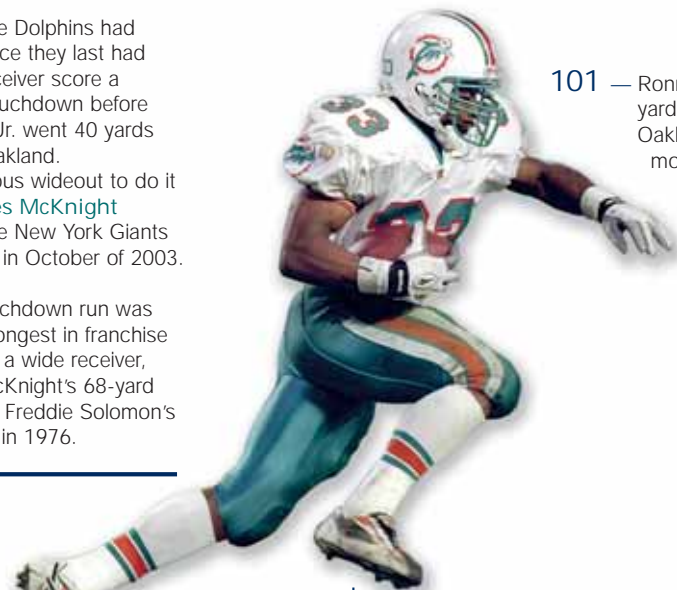

85 — Games the Dolphins had played since they last had a wide receiver score a rushing touchdown before Ted Ginn Jr. went 40 yards against Oakland. The previous wideout to do it was **James McKnight** against the New York Giants (68 yards) in October of 2003.

40 — Ginn's touchdown run was the third-longest in franchise history for a wide receiver, behind McKnight's 68-yard score and Freddie Solomon's 59-yarder in 1976.

101 — Ronnie Brown's 101 yards rushing against Oakland helped him move past **Karim Abdul-Jabbar** into sixth place on the Dolphins' all-time list.



10 — Chad Pennington is the first Dolphins quarterback to start at least the first 10 games since Jay Fiedler in 2001.

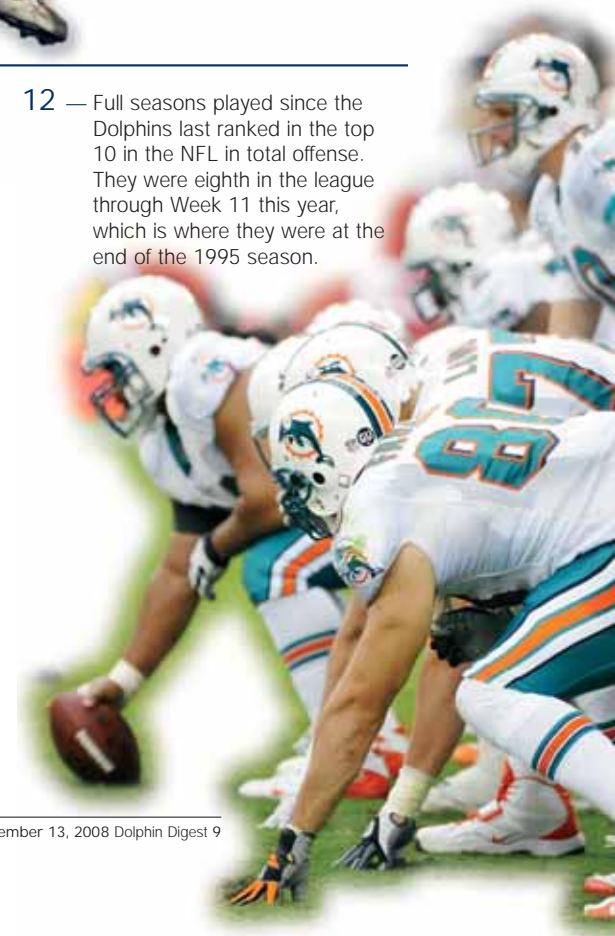
341 — Pennington's passing yards against New England set a new career high, topping the 339 he threw for in a 26-13 victory at Minnesota in 2006.

10 — It was remarkably exactly 10 years to the day that the Dolphins last gave up a 400-yard passing game prior to Sunday against the Patriots. That came on Nov. 23, 1998 when Drew Bledsoe passed for 423 yards.

14.5 — Joey Porter's sack against New England gave him 14.5 on the season, a new Dolphins record for linebackers. He broke the mark of 14 set by Bryan Cox in 1992.

11 — The victory over Oakland was the Dolphins' 11th in their last 14 meetings against teams from the AFC West. The Dolphins are 3-0 against that division this season, with only a Dec. 21 game at Kansas City remaining.

12 — Full seasons played since the Dolphins last ranked in the top 10 in the NFL in total offense. They were eighth in the league through Week 11 this year, which is where they were at the end of the 1995 season.



6 — Roster moves made at safety since the start of the regular season after **Courtney Bryan** was signed and Brannon Condren was waived.
